ESSAY CATEGORIES & AWARDS

***CATEGORY IV:
Grades 11th and 12th**

**Juneteenth-Bellamy-Taylor
Academic Talent Scholarship**

Award Values:

1st Place - \$500 (scholarship*)

2nd Place - \$400 (scholarship*)

**University of Olivet
Academic Talent Scholarship**

Award Values:

1st Place – Essay Winner (scholarship)**

2nd Place – Essay Winner (scholarship)**

Scholarship Value – Up to \$30,000 (Tuition Only)

**** Awarding is based on the student’s admittance to and subsequent attendance at Olivet University**

- The contest is open to students in 6th – 12th grades in the greater Lansing, MI area school district and surrounding area.
- There will be one 1st place and one 2nd place winner selected for each category.
- A certificate of participation will be given to all students who enter and meet the contest criteria.
- Winners will be notified in writing or by phone.
- Any student who has previously won an award is ineligible for entry into this year’s contest unless participant has moved to a new category. Ex: From Category I to Category II, Category II to III or IV.
- 11th and 12th graders may only apply for one of the scholarships in Category IV.
- Awarding of the University of Olivet Academic Talent Scholarships (Category IV) is based on the student’s admittance to and subsequent attendance at Olivet University.

ESSAY TOPICS / CRITERIA

CATEGORY IV- Talent Scholarships for Grades 11th and 12th

Topic – Write your 600-to-800-word essay on the following:

- 1.** Explain the historical context that led to Juneteenth.
- 2.** What is Juneteenth and why is celebrating it more important today than ever before?
- 3.** Draw a connection between the Juneteenth celebration of freedom and other cultural celebrations of freedom or independence.
- 4.** Reflect on why it is important that we continue to recognize and cultivate knowledge of and appreciation for other cultural celebrations of freedoms across the world.

Essay Writing Requirements.

- Essays must be the student's original work. Plagiarism will not be accepted.
- Essay must be complete and formatted per the student application checklist (see application).
 - Typed in 12 pt. or 14 pt. Times New Roman or Arial font
 - Double spaced with a bibliography listing all references used.
 - Word count cannot be less than or exceed category range.
 - Submitted on Word or as PDF document only.
- Essay must have a title and stay on the topic. Essays will be judged on the correct use of grammar, spelling, punctuation, and originality.
- Maps, drawings, pictures, and graphics should not be included.

ENTRY SUBMISSIONS & AWARD ANNOUNCEMENTS

- **Entries received after April 13th, 2024 will not be eligible and will not be returned.**
 - Essay submissions can be submitted to the Juneteenth website (www.lansingjuneteenthcelebration.org) from February 25th – April 13th, 2024. Please check website for drop off locations for hard copies.
 - The Juneteenth Essay and Scholarship Award program will be held on **June 13th, 2024 at Lansing Community College. Time 6:00 PM.**
 - **Any student having previously won an award is ineligible** for entry into the same category, however, the student is eligible if, moving to a new category. Ex: From Category I to Category II or Category III to Category IV
- Awarding of the Juneteenth Bellamy-Taylor- Academic Talent Scholarship is based upon the following:**
- Students who need to speak to a Scholarship Specialist to secure more funding may do so by notifying the Juneteenth Education Sub-Committee.
 - **Awarding of the University of Olivet Academic Talent Scholarships (Category IV only)** is based on the student's ability to be admitted to, and subsequently attend the University of Olivet. To be considered for admission to Olivet:
 - Students must complete an application for admission to the University of Olivet, which can be done at admissions@olivetcollege.edu .
 - Students must submit official high school transcripts to University of Olivet.
 - Students must submit official ACT or SAT scores to the University of Olivet.
 - Admission is based on a combination of the student's cumulative high school GPA and ACT or SAT score
 - Students will be considered for admission after all official, requested admissions documents are submitted to the admissions office.
